Making Time for Social Studies

The factors that impact pacing vary from district to district. They might include expectations for instructional minutes, whether minutes are shared with another subject, flexibility in daily schedules, reporting deadlines, or whether the district uses quarters or trimesters.

This document includes several types of pacing guides:

- Year-at-a-Glance Pacing for K-5: A broad overview of the year, broken into monthly segments for a flexible, comprehensive approach.
- Alternating Subjects Week-by-Week Pacing: For districts alternating social studies and another subject (often science) weekly. This guide provides weekly lessons and suggested minutes.
- Alternating Subjects Unit-by-Unit Pacing: For districts alternating subjects by unit. This detailed guide offers weekly lessons, suggested minutes, and flexible Extension lessons.

How much time do I need to teach Inquiry Journeys?

In a typical 180-day school year, you can expect to spend 30-60 instructional days per unit, depending on whether social studies is taught daily or alternates with another subject.

Lessons are designed for 45 minutes, with shorter 30-minute lessons for kindergarten.
